#### Annual Neighborhood Association Meeting October 28, 2003

The first item on the agenda will be a short general meeting with the election of new officers for the board. We will also have a general rundown of the activities the association has been involved with this past year.

The second topic will be a presentation from Roger German of Silver Hammer Construction. He will be providing homeowners with tips and suggestions for weatherizing the home. If time permits we will also open the floor to questions from homeowners on problems they have and possible solutions to these problems.

The third topic of the evening will be a presentation by the newly formed Witherbee Neighborhood Association directly to the North of the 40th & A Neighborhood Association. # Neighborhoods Inc. 2121 North 27th Street

Neighborhoods Inc. (formerly Neighborhood Housing Service of Lincoln) is a non-profit, community-based housing organization established in 1986 to revitalize Lincoln's original neighborhoods. Since its inception, Neighborhood Inc. has assisted over 1000 families in purchasing or improving their homes and annually provides more than 400 consumers with homebuyer education and home improvement classes.

Through a cooperative effort with Lincoln High School, Neighborhood Inc. has constructed 14 high school houses since 1989. One of the first endeavors of its kind, this innovative community development project has been replicated nationwide.

Each year, a new house is built by Lincoln High Construction Trades students under contractor supervision. The house is then sold to a qualified first-time homebuyer. Students, neighborhood residents, and the new homeowners all benefit from this special program.

The 40th & A Neighborhood Association along with Neighborhoods Inc. staff identified the property at 869 South 45th Street as viable site to build a new home. The owners at that time was unwilling to entertain any communications much less an offer. By staying alert to an opportunity the neighborhood became aware that the property had change ownership and suggested that the new owners approach Neighborhood Inc.. After negotiations the owners sold the property so that Neighborhood Inc. could demolish the existing house and build a new one.

Lincoln High Students will start building a new house for the 2003/2004 school year beginning August 26. Two different classes, each with 20 to 30 students, will work on the house every school day until its completion around June 1, 2004.
